



“GOING GREEN TOGETHER”

Dear esteemed guest,

We are aiming to protect our environment and try to lessen our footprint! Please find below some measures we have taken to fit our approach!

🌱 You will receive a double insulated steel bottle upon your arrival which you can use as your water bottle. Your guide will assist in filling it up during your game drives and whilst on road transfers. **The bottle is your souvenir to take home!**

🌱 In a bid to curb plastic pollution and **eliminate Single Use Plastic**, we encourage you to not use plastic straws / coffee cups with lids / plastic cutlery / any other throw away packaging.

🌱 For your waste disposal, we encourage you to use our “**recycled kikapu**” which is located at the back of your car. (Yellow & White in color)

🌱 When staying in camps & lodges, Please be mindful about water usage! **Support water conservation** by reducing the flow of water from the tap when taking a shower, shaving, brushing and washing hands and by closing the taps when not in use.

🌱 Please re-use towels or dry them instead of getting them replaced daily

🌱 For any packaged soap, we provide you with a **brown paper bag** in your vehicle. Kindly drop your extra toiletries in this bag. We shall then distribute them to children in need at St. John’s School in Korogocho Slum, Nairobi.

🌱 We would like to inform you that it is illegal to purchase items made from ivory, animal hair, animal horns. (Often cow horn is mistaken for ivory)



- When at the coast / beach, Please do not pick up sea shells or coral stones.
- Take as many photos as you like, but leave only footprints and positive contributions
- Environment Watch:** You will find stickers at the back of your vehicle with an emergency number that is provided to report any **environmental issues** such as wildlife harassment, wild fires, littering in the parks, an injured animal etc. Please indicate the location, time of incidence and date as well as photos either on WhatsApp or by e-mail. The relevant authorities will then take this up.
- A “**single use plastic ban**” to all National Parks / Game Reserves / Forests & Protected areas will take place from June 5th, 2020. We would like to inform you of the same well in advance.
- Plastic bags are banned in Kenya since 2017! A full single use plastic ban is in place in Rwanda since 2019.
- If you’d like to participate in “**green activities in Kenya**” you may want to plant a tree at Eburru Forest or donate towards Tree Growing initiatives. Please speak to your guide about details!
- The **Safari Card** is available for purchase from the East African Wildlife Society and you will receive benefits such as a conservation based wildlife magazine and contribute to various projects through your participation!
